# Report from 2nd Meeting – July 2012

## **Day #1**

Members from 19 statewide advocacy agencies and area board regions continued to "build a bridge" to increase leadership by persons with disabilities. They shared views about the Network purpose and their job as members. Then added ideas about a logo that helps others understand what the Network is all about. Everyone shared updates on advocacy mission statements and activities in their communities. Time was also spent practicing

### **Technology Training**

Members had many opportunities to practice online technology, video calling and the Network Google group. Reaching across the state to communicate with one another and exchange information in communities remains important work as members began to host meetings using video conferencing. Future video use includes inviting new partners to online meetings to accomplish regional advocacy plans. Using video conferencing will provide an alternative to having all meeting in person, especially when it takes two hours to get to a meeting that only lasts for an hour.
